

Glue


Stickers, paper, and other decoration things

About 5000 Mexican soldiers arrived to siege the Alamo. The leader of the Texans, Lieutenant Colonel William Barret Travis sent out a message that said: "I shall never surrender or retreat". Luckily a relief party passed through the Mexicans and came to the Alamo, increasing the small band of men to 189. Some other 400 men were on their way but they were delayed and had to turn back. The siege of the Alamo lasted for 13 days. Soon the Texans were running out of ammunition and Santa Anna decided to make his attack. He sent about 1500 soldiers into the Alamo. The Texans fought hard but it is widely believed that all were killed in battle. Only four people survived. A wife, her baby, her Mexican nurse, and Colonel Travis's black slave loe. Soon "Remember the Alamo" became a battle cry. General Sam Houston defeated Santa Anna later in a surprising way. He surprised the Mexican army during their afternoon siesta! So in the end Texas did get her independence even though it cost them many

Dear Dr. Wise,

What makes jalapeños spicy?

From Hot Stuff

Dear, "Hot Stuff"

I would first like to note that your parents are notably "creative" for picking that particular name for you. Second of all, the jalapeños are not the spicy ones. The white stuff (not the seed) in the middle is what adds that zing to it. It contains a special chemical called capsaicin that protects the jalapeño plan t from getting eaten because most animals tongues get burnt off with it. Ours do too, it's just our tongues are stronger than animals tongues. Also, if you drink water, that just spreads the capsaicin. If you eat food, that absorbs it, thus stopping the burning sensation.



This experiment tests Wormy's behavior to other things. Wormy won't die or become Wormy I and Wormy 2. Get a jar, some earthworms, Dirt, some water, and a bright light. Keep the light on until the experiment tells you to turn it off.

- I. Fill your container at least halfway with dirt.
- 2. Place the worms on top of the dirt.
- 3. Let the whole thing sit for 30 minutes or more and see what happens to the worms.
 - 4. Turn off the light so that everything is pretty dim.
 - 5. Pour water on the dirt to make the dirt really wet but not flooding
 - 6. Wait for 30 minutes again and see what happens to the worms
 - 7. Clean up everything and go fishing!

If you did everything right the worms probably went down at first because of the bright light. They sense the light and are afraid of it because they might dry out if they are in it too much. Earthworms breathe through their skin and they have to have moist skin if they want to breathe. In the second part the worms should have come out onto the dirt again. They are afraid that if the soil gets too wet, they won't be able to breath through their skin so they come up to the top of the ground to avoid that. They also come up because they can get their skin moist better up top than down below. So worms have sense too. Think about that next time you handle one.




Leprechaun Stuff

To make four leaf clovers grow out of three leaf clovers, You need, a garden tray, some garden gel (be careful with it) or other kinds of fertilizer. and of course, three leaf clovers. (You need the root also. Not just the stem and leaves.) Be **sure** to ask your parents about this experiment.

Now plant the three leaf clovers in the garden tray with soil and wait until the plants look pretty healthy. Follow the directions on the plant gel container to fertilize the soil and wait. Be very, very careful with the plant gel or fertilizer and make sure to ask your parents to help you. Wait a while longer and see if there are four leafed offspring. It might not work the first time though.

Hatshepsut's Life




